He then moved to Pittsburgh to open PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates where he helped earn many awards for the ball park food. In 2003, Chef Gil took over the culinary management of Churchill Downs. He spent the next seven years in Louisville running the Kentucky Derby and all events at Churchill.
